The NTIA announcement of their intention to transfer the IANA functions, the NETmundial, the Enhanced Cooperation workgroup under the CSTD, the WSIS+10 outcome, the revision of the Global IGF model and the Snowden Revelations are recent developments with regard of global public policy. Some legislations and practices in the Arab Countries are enforced to allegedly protect national security and defend against terrorism. The panel in this session explores the extent to which these practices infringe on the rights of end users versus the government's responsibility to protect its citizens, and attempts to balance between these two interests.</p> <p>Questions addressed include: Should there be, and how to develop, a regulatory framework that respects and protects users' rights – including offline rights such as the right to secure livelihoods? "Should online content and access to it be regulated by special laws? Is the end user's right to access and produce content absolute? Critical infrastructure has come under the control of ever more complex computer systems. Recent events have shown that the issue of "Internet Control: Between Security and Privacy" is becoming very central.
